We have many talented boys, no more so than four younger boys who entertained the parents and teachers before the annual PTA meeting last Saturday afternoon. Their recitals were outstanding and it was a privilege to have been sitting in this Hall listening attentively to our younger boys' performances.

Another excellent example of partnership has been the 10th Hong Kong Scout Group's 90 years at the College. To celebrate their 90th anniversary the Scouts will be holding a major dinner in this hall on the 24th November called *Homecoming*. This will be a formal dinner with invited guests from the Hong Kong scout association along with distinguished scouts from years past. It promises to be a grand event. As will the Alumni Choir concert on the 4th November at Chai Wan. Called an *Ode to St. Paul's* the concert is a tribute to the Revd. Moses Wu, the music teacher who led the choir through years of success more than forty years ago.
