We were delighted to have the Archbishop of Hong Kong (and Bishop of the Diocese of Hong Kong) the Most Revd. Dr. Paul Kwong speak at our Assembly on the 12th November.

Our theme for that week was about "Peace." The Archbishop spoke about how we can achieve peace and told of a man who had begun his life by praying to change the world. Later on in his life and not succeeding, he altered his prayer to one asking to change those around him: his friends and family. At the end of his life and still not having his prayers fulfilled he realised that he had wasted an opportunity throughout his life because he needed to begin by praying to change himself.

At a time in the life of Hong Kong with such divided opinions, it is worth remembering that real change begins from within. Fundamental to that change is the role of education. Malala Yousafzai, the 17 year old girl from Pakistan who was shot two years ago on her way to school and is now the youngest recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize said: "Let us pick up our books and our pens, they are the most powerful weapons. One child, one teacher, one book and one pen can change the world."

Music Scholarship

St. Paul's College offers two kinds of music scholarship schemes: 1) a 6-year scholarship to primary 6 students who are admitted to Form 1, and 2) a 1-year scholarship to Form 1 to Form 6 students through internal application. This scholarship is awarded based on their performance in audition, participation in music activities and contribution to the school.

This year, two Form 1 students were awarded the 6-year scholarship. As for the 1-year scholarship, the department received 19 applications from Form 1 and Form 6 students. Over the past two weeks, those candidates were busy with their preparation for the audition. They played various instruments: piano, violin, viola, cello, flute, clarinet, horn, dizi and voice at the audition. The standard of their performance was very high and the judging panel had a difficult job choosing the winners of the scholarships. The results will be announced later this month.

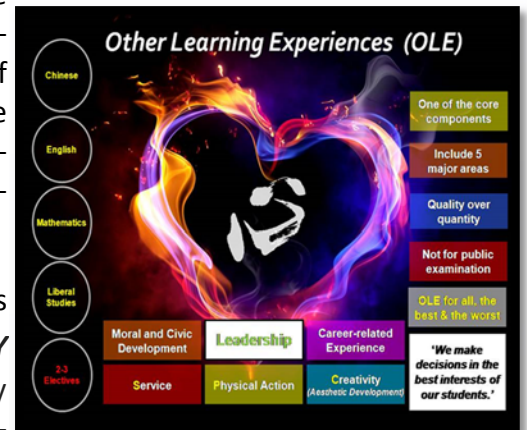
1. Adventure-based Leadership Training Course Organising Committee
